

## The Moral Argument

### 4. The Contrast of Good and Evil

- **Romans 12:9** – *“Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good.”*  
(Believers are called to actively reject evil and cling to good.)
- **Amos 5:14–15** – *“Seek good, and not evil, that you may live; and so the Lord, the God of hosts, will be with you... Hate evil, and love good, and establish justice in the gate.”*  
(Good and evil are opposites, rooted in God’s nature.)
- **Proverbs 8:13** – *“The fear of the Lord is hatred of evil.”*  
(Reverence for God naturally produces rejection of evil.)

### 5. Christ as the Full Revelation of God’s Goodness

- **John 1:5** – *“The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.”*
