

# Biblical Creationist Reverse Timeline –Handout

Based on a traditional young-earth chronology (~4004 BC Creation).

## Reverse Chronological Timeline with Scripture References:

- Present Day – ~6,000 years since Creation
- 33 AD – Crucifixion & Resurrection (Matthew 27–28; John 19–20)
- 4 BC – Birth of Christ (Luke 2)
- 586 BC – Fall of Jerusalem (2 Kings 25)
- 1010 BC – David becomes king (2 Samuel 5)
- 1446 BC – The Exodus (Exodus 12–14)
- 2000 BC – Call of Abraham (Genesis 12)
- 2242 BC – Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1–9)
- 2348 BC – The Flood (Genesis 6–9)
- 4004 BC – Creation Week (Genesis 1–2)

## Theological Themes Across the Timeline:

- Creation – God as Creator and Sustainer
- The Fall – Humanity’s need for redemption (Genesis 3)
- The Flood – Judgment and mercy
- Babel – Human pride and divine sovereignty
- Abraham – Covenant promise
- Exodus – Deliverance and redemption
- Kingdom – Promise of a coming Messiah
- Christ – Fulfillment of prophecy and salvation

### Discussion Questions:

1. How does viewing history as beginning with Creation shape a Christian worldview?
2. What does the Flood reveal about both God's justice and His mercy?
3. Why is the Tower of Babel significant for understanding nations and languages?
4. How do God's promises to Abraham connect to the life of Christ?
5. Why is the Resurrection the central event in this timeline?
6. How does understanding a unified biblical timeline strengthen faith?
7. What questions or challenges arise when comparing this view with modern historical models?
